Canadian Short Board Rules

Our boards have a 14 foot playing surface with a center ' Hog Line'. You must pass this line to enter the scoring zone for 1,2 or 3 points and of course the 4 point hanging rock.

We use the 3 judge system for point discrepancies. Most of our tournaments are open doubles (bring your own partner).

We do have a few draw tournaments and this season we are holding our first A/B (Pro/Am) tourney. This is our effort to recruit new players and match them with more experienced players enabling them to pick up some tips and build their confidence.

We play a single round robin game and depending on how many entry's we have we will divide the teams into divisions for the sake of time, as we have only 3 boards in our venues.

We also play losing points which count towards a win . The top 2 teams from each division advance to the playoffs. Again the playoff is a single round robin. Every team plays each other once for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place.

That's about it for our format. Pretty simple and it works well for us.

What is the OSA?

The OSA is one of eight charters incorporated under the Canadian Shuffleboard Congress.



The OSA charter is comprised of three main areas in Southern Ontario:

Kitchener / Milton / Niagara Region Each of these areas organize their own tournaments, usually on a monthly basis, and all tournaments are open to anyone who wishes to play.

The criteria for playing in the OSA play downs are: A league member must have played in 3 tournaments during the season. (Nov – May)
Non-league members must have played in 5 tournaments during the season.(Nov-May)

There are seven other charters extending from Kingston in eastern Ontario to Victoria British Columbia. Every year players from each of these charters compete at a provincial level in order to qualify to play in the one week long Canadian Championship event, held every October.

There are five categories of competition which are: Ladies Singles, Men's Singles, Ladies Doubles, Men's Doubles and Mixed Doubles

The job of hosting this event each year is done in a rotational manner from province to province.
